This prestigious magazine attributes its unique attraction mostly to Quebec's effervescent cultural life, the beautifully restored buildings which preserved their historic character, and the city's excellent potential in terms of sustainable development.

QUEBEC, CITY OF WORLD HERITAGE

In December 1985, the United Nations Educational, Scientific and Cultural Organisation (UNESCO) entered historical Old Quebec on its prestigious World Heritage List. By doing so, UNESCO recognised its exceptional universal value. Indeed, its architecture and city

landscape reflect the role Quebec played as capital city under the French, British and Canadian regimes. Strategic stronghold for nearly three centuries, Quebec has preserved the main components of its historic defence system, which makes it the only city in North America to be surrounded by authentic fortified walls.

JAZZING IT UP WITH THE WORLD

Located at an exceptional geographic and cultural crossroads, Quebec holds an enviable place on the international scene acting, so to speak, as the bridge between Europe and the Americas. This city, known throughout the world for its rich history and heritage, is also modern as well as dynamic. Its economical and cultural strengths promote relations with cities around the world.

400 YEARS TO CELEBRATE!

For French-speaking Americans, it all began on July 3, 1608, when Samuel de Champlain decided to settle in Kebec "where the river narrows". At this time, he had no idea that he would be marking the beginning of the great French adventure across the Atlantic. By choosing this site on the river and building a residence there, Champlain would be

A GREEN SWEEP

Since its opening in 1996, the Québec City Convention Centre has taken concrete actions to reduce the negative impact of its operations on the environment. Its optimization of work methods, success in reducing greenhouse gas (GHG) emissions, strong energy record, and other effective environmental measures have already earned the Centre two awards—the 2003 ÉcoGESte Award in the category Building Management and the 2004 Stellaris Award in the category Energy Efficiency for cutting GHG emissions 50% and reducing energy consumption per square meter by more than 30%.

The Québec City Convention Centre is a proud member of both the Canadian Green Building Council and the U.S. Green Building Council and is currently in the process of obtaining LEED (Leadership in Energy and Environmental Design) accreditation for existing building. It is well on its way to being the first convention centre to obtain such certification in Canada.
